Open Enrollment Space Availability – The principals and I are beginning to work on the planning for next school. Additionally, during the January School Board meeting we also must bring to the Board any type of open enrollment limitations we are recommending Because of our staffing, we typically limit accepting open enrollment applications for students enrolling with certain types of special education needs. That has worked well because we always have new special education students enroll as residents of our district and we are not completely over-taxing our special education staff.

The principals and I have talked about some of our grade levels that have higher enrollments and possibly requesting that some grade levels be capped for open enrollment for the 2025-2026 school year. We had limitations on two different grade levels last school year, and we are proposing limits on four grade levels for next school year as well.

The principals and I determined that the **grades** of **4,5**, **6 and 8** for next school year have higher numbers of students in them at this time, we are requesting that the Board not allow additional new open enrolled student to enter those grade levels.

The principals and I did talk extensively about the pros and cons of requesting limitations for some grade levels. We do want to be a "destination school district" for as many students as possible. However, we also want to provide the best education possible for all of our students. We believe the best way to do that is to require a limit on some grade levels. Additionally, we are primarily concerned about grades 4K through 8. Once students reach high school age, their class structures are more disbursed through a wider variety of subject areas and courses.

Open Enrollment 2025-26

Regular Education Students

The Valders Area District does not intend to set spacing needs, or deny applicants due to space, when acting on open enrollment applications for regular education students except for grades 4,5,6 and 8.

Setting of Spaces for Special Education Programs

Wis.
